SELF ADVOCACY

Self advocacy is an important step for our students. Being able to ask a question for clarification or help without being prompted will help them become more independent.



Using Cue Cards



Using the cue cards when they are able to do the task independently or when they need help is a good first step.



Question Prompting



Prompts to ask for what a student needs. Specific questions a student can ask when they need help.



Steps to take



Different visuals for steps to take when students are not sure what to do. A card for students to follow before asking the teacher for help. Five finger counting step and try three before me steps.
